In this conference Analytical psychology, Psychoanalysis and Psychology will reflect on the evil and suffering that dominate relationships in the post-modern society. Indeed, we cannot ignore that hatred and violence are increasingly becoming part of our daily life.

The death of God and the beheading of transcendence have indelibly marked the conduct of a society that is inescapably heading towards self-destruction. Therefore, human being is called for rediscovering the meaning of life.

Over the 20th century, the Freudian "return of the repressed" has freed drives and instincts, until dehumanizing the post-modern society. At the dawn of the 21st century it has become crucial to recover the sense of humanity. This, after being magnified by the scientific, enlightening, and technological omnipotence, had become a colossus with clay feet, deprived of its sense of existence and transcendence.

Depth psychologies, namely Analytical psychology and Psychoanalysis, offer a valuable contribution - through their symbolic approach to experience and knowledge - to the current problems of post-modern society. In fact, the latter tends to avoid the fear of death by means of paroxysmal consumerism and subtle collective suicidal modes, such as resorting to drugs and violent behaviours.

Even suicide can be seen as an omnipotent attempt to escape from the fear of death. Only a true process of death and rebirth can lead individual and collective consciousness to those spiritual dimensions that Jung put at the base of mental disorders, when he stated that any form of "neurosis" originates from an unresolved religious problem. Our conference therefore will deal with the anthropological implications of this unsolved problem, both in terms of human relationships - namely individual and social violence - and male-female relationship - namely the "couple dysfunctions" as well as the deep identity disorientation of adolescents related to this. The great Jewish and Christian figures, the spiritual practices of the Far East, and the search for a maternal original knowledge seem all to pave the way to a radical renewal of human and environmental existence, which is becoming increasingly necessary.
